## Joyfully on His Journey



All Saint's Day is typically observed on November 1<sup>st</sup>. Did you know that Halloween has its origins in the phrase "All Hallows' Eve", which was about remembering the Saints who had died over the past year. You may hear of particular saints or "heroes of the faith" having their own day set aside where people remember them. There can be good that comes from that. But traditions and holidays change in society and the church. But the goal of celebrating All Saints' Day is to remember those in recent past so that we might long for the future when Jesus returns to change it all to how he promises it to be.

Remembering the past is always important because it should give us courage to move forward. That's what happened with the Israelites when Moses died and it gave way to Joshua the new leader. They took time to mourn their leader and their loved ones. (Deuteronomy 34:8-10). God even calls the Israelites to remember even further beyond that when he says, "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of Egypt, out of the land of slavery." (Ex 20:2) He institutes the Passover Meal that still continues to this day in many Jewish households.

But the past is not important simply because it came before, but because God uses history to point us towards what he does in the future. For Israel their past pointed them toward the Messiah who was promised to Eve to come and crush the serpent's head (Genesis 3:15). Their future was ALWAYS a future filled with hope because in God's promises there is always hope.

So how do we honor the past in our day and time? One way is All Saints' Day. Even in death God allows our loved ones who fell asleep in faith to bless us today by the encouragement of their faith. We honor them by recalling their life and walk of faith. We honor those in the past by taking photos, writing article and stories about them. We catalog the past. But again, it is not simply because we love the past and want to go back to the past, but rather because God wants us to see what lies ahead.

St. Paul saw this and encouraged his fellow Christians to look at the future saying, "Brothers I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus" (Phil 3:13-14). Hearing that can cause a bit discomfort for us because it sounds as though Paul is saying the past is of no use to him. And in a way our discomfort would be correct, but not in the way that we think. For Paul goes on to see how the past shapes the future. "Keep your eyes on those who walk according to the example you have in us..." and later "Our citizenship is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform our lowly body to be like his glorious body..." (Phil 3:17, 20-21).

When you fall asleep due to death in the arms of Jesus, you are waiting for the future. What that means for us is ALL those who die in faith are already ahead of us, they aren't in the past. Their death was serious, sad, maybe even tragic and unexpected, but they are NOT in the past as if to say they will never exist again. For Paul reminds us, we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ and those who are sainted before us are already with him now still even looking to the future when they will be rejoined with a new body! So, the past, sure it may have good memories, but what if God was promising to you in this month better than just memories, a new life, a new reality. So eagerly wait for his coming when we are joined with all the saints in the marriage feast of God's kingdom. Happy All Saints' Day.

## *Ramblings of the chairman:*

The Executive Council is currently working on the budget for 2023. Each of our mission groups has received their request forms for the budget which is to include a brief summary of their goals looking forward, and how the funds they are requesting from the congregation will be used. The council is also looking at our current budget and offerings to see if the congregation is adequately supporting the work that Good Shepherd voters have chosen to do. We'll have more information as we get closer to the annual voter's meeting.

Each time the Mission Leaders meet, I am always amazed at how much time and effort is given by the members of Good Shepherd. Have you ever considered, on any given Sunday, how many people are involved in preparing the church for that one service. Have you ever considered the hours given by the members of our Sunday School staff, VBS workers, Youth group leaders, Bible study leaders, Trustees, Elders, and so on.

Given our country's economic situation, I'm guessing that our projected 2023 Budget numbers will be higher than those of 2022. That being said, I decided to do an internet search for passages about giving, to the Lord (through the church) and to the Lord (through individuals who need help); because in both situations our gifts are to the Lord. There are so many passages that speak about giving, that it would take way too much paper to list them all. First of all, I want to refer to Ephesians 2:8 that says our salvation is a gift from God by grace through faith and that we can do nothing, nor boast that we can do anything, to earn it.

This is followed by Ephesians 2:9 & 10 where we're told that we do good works that have been prepared in advance for us by God. I find this interesting because when we do something (a good work) for the church or for an individual, that opportunity to give was also a gift from the Lord.

So, what about giving! 2 Corinthians 9:6 & 7 says that we should give generously from the heart and not do it reluctantly or under compulsion.


God loves a cheerful giver.

Matthew 6:1-4 reminds us to do our giving in secret and not boast about what we've done. Our giving to the Lord is not something we should do for the recognition from others, God sees what we do in private.

There is also a promise from God in 2 Corinthians 9:6 & 7, Proverbs 11:24, and Luke 6:38 saying that God will bless our giving by multiplying his blessings. In Corinthians, "whoever sows generously will also reap generously". In Proverbs "one man gives freely, yet gains even more; another withholds unduly, but comes to poverty." Finally in Luke "Give, and it will be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over, will be poured into your lap. For the measure you use, it will be measured to you."

In all these passages it became clear to me that all we have or possess are blessings from the Lord and that the greatest blessing from the Lord is our salvation and second to this is his desire that we share all his blessings with others.

I don't see any way that we can out-give the Lord.

## *Altar Guild*

We are soon reaching the end of another year, and are having an organizational meeting to fill our Altar calendar for the new year. Please prayerfully consider signing up for a month to fill our calendar.

I am once again going to talk about the Linens that are used to cover the top (mensa) of the Altar and other cloth coverings which are made from real linen. Unlike the paraments, these linens are mostly white in color and are not changed according to the color of the Church Year.

The linen that is placed directly on the top of the mensa (altar) is the cerecloth. Traditionally this cloth was a heavy white fabric that had been treated with wax. Its purpose was to keep the dampness of the stone mensa, of old, from ruining the fair linens. On our altars of today, made of wood, this protection is no longer necessary, but may still be used to protect the wood. It can also be used as a cushion or padding to eliminate clanging when the vessels are put on the altar. This cerecloth is the exact size of the mensa and should never hangover the edges. The second linen is placed over the cerecloth, it is called the frontal linen when it is attached to the frontal or superfrontal to hold either of those paraments in place, or protector linen when it's not. The purpose of this cloth is to protect the fair linen from the wax in the cerecloth. This linen is also the exact size of the mensa.

In October, the Altar was beautified with flowers from the Rasmussen's. If you would like to provide flowers for the Altar, we welcome you to do so, weekly or monthly.
