




February Newsletter 2026

Ah February, the month remembered by the celebration of Valentine's Day! Personally, I have a few other things that take precedence over the modern conception of Valentine's Day: the birthday of my beloved wife Danielle, the birthday of my dear son Judah, and the birthday of my faithful father Clark. Oh, I should mention they are all on the same day! So, with Valentine's Day coming just a few days after their birthday, I'm not always focused on sharing chocolates, cartoon-shaped red hearts, or other gifts like others are on Valentine's Day. But I'll never forget when my wife and I first started dating, I realized that her birthday and Valentine's Day were so close together. I knew they both should probably remain separate and special in their own way, but I figured I should ask. Maybe there was some way she liked to celebrate the two that I should know about! I was told very clearly that the birthday and Valentine's Day should in fact remain separate and special. Imagine if I didn't keep Valentine's Day and the birthdays separate because it just makes sense to combine them all. It's the most logical, isn't it?

Now that's my own unique set of circumstances. In the IX Article of the Augsburg Confession, we get a set of circumstances that applies to all of God's church — a set of circumstances regarding baptism that still affects the Church today. Article IX addressed an attack on the doctrine of Baptism during the time of the Reformation. The attack was coming from the group known as the "Anabaptists," which literally means "re-baptizer" or "again baptizer." This teaching was important to address because historically the Lutheran reformers needed to show they were not teaching this rebaptism for the sake of working together to overcome differences with the Roman Catholic Church. If Lutherans were teaching this, it would be a serious deal breaker with the Roman Catholic Church.

The article in the Augsburg Confession and the Apology of the Augsburg Confession is quite short, unlike previous teachings. This shows you won't find disagreement between Lutheran Reformers and the Roman Catholic Church. But that doesn't mean the Anabaptist teaching is ignored. Perhaps seeing the Article will help you understand why allowing this teaching would create such a problem. Here it is:



Imagine being taught that God's grace offered through baptism to a child is not right. We can't teach anything other than God's word. Matthew 28:19 is where Jesus commands to "baptize all nations." This includes all men, women, children, and yes even infants. Salvation by God's grace through faith is offered with Baptism. So as believers in Jesus, we reject the teaching that baptism of children is not right.

We as Lutherans don't just teach "infant baptism," we teach Baptism for all nations because it shows all people who God is and says he will be for them! The Large Catechism puts it plainly: "Everything depends upon the Word and commandment of God. My faith does not make baptism, it receives baptism. We bring the child with the intent and hope that it may believe, and we pray God to grant it faith.

As we have once obtained forgiveness of sins in baptism, so forgiveness remains day by day as long as we live..." Children, infants, adults, men, and women need God's grace through forgiveness won by Jesus. And all people have that in baptism!


Let me take you back to my Valentine's Day/Birthday conundrum. Why is it important for me to highlight two days that are so close together in special separate ways? It isn't about the day, but it's about the person who I have come to know in relationship to those days.

In the same way, we don't reshape Baptism according to what seems logical or convenient; we receive it and give it just as God himself has given it for us to receive — full of his grace and promise meant for all who call on him because He has called them. May we continue to treasure God's gift of love in baptism because it reveals, for all nations, his loving heart.

ELDER'S CORNER

The Lenten Season

Grace, mercy, and peace to you from God our Father and from our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

The Lenten season in 2026 begins on Wednesday, February 18th and ends on Saturday, April 4th. This period lasts for 40 days, not including Sundays, and is a time of preparation for Easter. Ash Wednesday marks the Start of Lent, during which we engage in prayer, penance and for some fasting.

As we enter the holy season of Lent, the Church once again turns our hearts toward repentance, reflection, and renewal. Lent is not merely a time of self-denial, but a sacred journey that leads us to the cross of Christ, where our Savior bore our sins in His body and won for us forgiveness, life, and salvation.

The word *repentance* means more than sorrow over sin. It is a daily turning away from ourselves and a daily turning toward Christ. In this season, we are invited to examine our lives in the light of God's Law, to confess our sins honestly, and to cling in faith to the Gospel promise that "the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all sin" (1 John 1:7).

As an elder of this congregation, I encourage you to make faithful use of the gifts Christ gives His Church during Lent. Gather around God's Word in worship and in your daily devotions. Receive the forgiveness of sins in Holy Absolution. Come to the Lord's Table, where Christ gives His true body and blood for the strengthening of your faith. These are not works we offer to God, but gracious gifts He gives to us for our salvation.

Some people give something up for Lent(self-denial). From the perspective of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, "giving something up for Lent" is entirely a matter of Christian freedom. It would be wrong, from our perspective, for the church to make some sort of "law" requiring its members to "give something up for Lent," since the Scriptures themselves do not require this. If, on the other hand, a Christian wants to give something up for Lent as a way of remembering and personalizing the great sacrifice that Christ made on the cross for our sins, then that Christian is certainly free to do so--as long as he or she does not "judge" or "look down on" other Christians who do not choose to do this.

Is there something you enjoy that you want to sacrifice for a while, like your daily latte? Or is it a bad habit you want to conquer, like running in late to meetings with co-workers? Or perhaps it would be good for you to give up alcohol or chips or chocolate? Find something that works for you, and whatever it is, may it help you to turn towards God in this holy season of Lent.

Lent also calls us to lives of humble service and love toward our neighbors. Forgiven sinners are freed to serve, reflecting Christ's mercy in word and deed.

May this Lenten season draw you ever closer to Christ crucified and risen for you. We walk this journey together, confident in the hope of Easter.

ALTAR GUILD



We have some time, ordinary time until the Eve of Transfiguration, before the second division of the Church Year begins, which is Easter. The first subdivision of this is Lent. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday; the exact date depends on the date of Easter, which is April 5th this year, with Ash Wednesday being on February 18th. The name “Ash Wednesday” comes from a practice originated in the Middle Ages of ashes being sprinkled over the heads of those who came to church and went to confession. The ashes come from palms that were blessed on Palm Sunday the year before, (today the ashes are ordered). Both this rite and the traditional readings for the day call for an attitude of humility and repentance, a somber time.

Lent consists of forty days of abstinence and fasting, excluding the Sundays in between, which are not Sundays of Lent but Sundays in Lent. The fourth Sunday is called Laetare, which means “rejoice.” This Sunday was introduced to relieve some of the rigors of observing the Lenten fast, it can be considered the anticipation of the joy of Easter. This season continues until the eve of Palm Sunday.

“THE HOUR HAS COME FOR THE SON OF MAN TO BE GLORIFIED.” (Jn 12:23)

In the gospel of John, there is this theme of destiny with time. On seven different occasions there are references from John and from the lips of Jesus of his hour not yet having arrived, and then it finally does come. It is a tension that starts building with the very first miracle of Jesus, and when his disciples first put their faith in Him. Jesus says to his mother, “Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come.” (Jn 2:4)

This tension mounts until Jesus comes into Jerusalem riding a Donkey, and some outsiders, Greeks to be exact, come asking to see Jesus the promised one. Then Jesus says, “The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.”

This Lent season we will be exploring this tension in the life of Jesus, and consider our own appointed times in life to consider the mercy of God in Christ. We too know what future God has in store for us, and even though it may go through suffering and death, it will lead to resurrection!
