God really has blessed us at Good Shepherd. For many years in its 43-year history God has saved many lives, redeemed many people from darkness, terrible situations, and I wish I could document all the stories of God's goodness. Many people have shared over the past 3 years how their faith has been reinvigorated, praise God! It's clear that the love of God has given faith to all these stories so that more love would be poured out and trust in God's promises would be held onto.

As we continue in my newsletter articles looking at what the Bible teaches us about our faith and what we hold to in our confession of faith, we come to Article VI of the Augsburg Confession.

Article V and VI go hand in hand. Where Article V helps us see the necessity of the preaching office to obtain faith through hearing the gospel and receiving the sacrament, Article VI expands on the impact of faith. It should bring about a new obedience to God. The core of this article of faith comes from Luke 17:10. So many Christians think that once they follow Jesus, they need to earn their keep and prove their worth. But as Article VI puts it, "such faith should yield good fruit and good works that a person must do such good works as God has commanded for God's sake but not place trust in them as if thereby to earn grace before God."

ARTICLE VI AUGSBURG CONFESSION

The faith you and I have in Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit from God cannot and should not be dormant, lifeless, unhelpful. In the "Apology of the Augsburg Confession", apology is another word for defense, we find this,

"our opponets object to [righteousness] on account of Christ alone [based on] 1 Corinthians 13:2 'If I have all faith...but do not have love, I am nothing.' This passage of Paul requires love. We also require it. Whoever throws away love will not retain faith, however strong it may be, for that person does not retain the Holy Spirit."

This is incredibly important we realize how much over the past 43 ther is to be thankful for to God. Recently we talked in Bible study about what to do when people accuse Christians of being judgmental or mean, and Article VI of the Augsburg Confession clarifies that dilemma for us. We are beholden only to Christ who served all people in love and truth. So we too should love from faith in Jesus! Not to earn God's grace or favor, but because if we do not love, how soon will our faith be at risk! And all those who stand on their own love to please God wihtout faith in his son Jesus, how at risk are they. Let love fill our hearts and rekindle our faith.

I want to close with some advice to hone where the new obedience can begin to shape for all of us. When Jesus summarizes the commandments for us, "Love the Lord your God and love your neighbor as yourself." Love starts with those immediately around us. In the 43 years that Good Shepherd has existed God has fed faith so that it pour our good works that God has commanded. Start with one another at church. Love one another from the faith God has given you. Be obedient to him in all that you do. 1 Corinthians 10:31, "whatever you do do it all to the glory of God." And perhaps then we will start to see more love pour out beyond our walls into our friends lives, strangers lives, and yes even those who persecute God's name and his gospel.

We have a strong confession of faith founded on Jesus, taught from scripture, expressed in the Augsburg Confession and the Book of Concord let us ask God to use it to pour out love out of obedience to him. Amen.


The linens that are used to cover the top (Mensa) of the Altar and other cloth coverings are made from real linen. (These linens are to be laundered and NOT dry cleaned, which may cause shrinkage). Unlike the paraments, these linens are mostly white in color and are not changed according to the color of the Church Year. The linen that is placed directly on top of the Mensa (altar) is the cerecloth. Traditionally this cloth was a heavy white fabric that had been treated with wax. Its purpose was to keep the dampness of the stone Mensa, of old, from ruining the fair linens. On our altars today, made of wood, this protection is no longer necessary, but may still be used to protect the wood.

It can also be used as a cushion or padding to eliminate clanging when the vessels are put on the altar. This cerecloth is the exact size of the Mensa and should never hangover the edges. The second linen is placed over the cerecloth, it is called the frontal linen when it is attached to the frontal or superfrontal to hold either of those paraments in place, or protector linen when it's not. The purpose of this cloth is to protect the fair linen from the wax in the cerecloth. This linen is also the exact size of the Mensa.

Until We Reach Home:

Is a story by Lynn Austin about three young girls from Sweden who leave their homeland after their parents die. Elin writes to an uncle in Chicago to see if they could come to their place. Dreaming of a better life they leave on a ship to America. They undergo lots of challenges on the ship including Elin taking care of a sick family that has typhoid. When they finally see America, Elin and Kristen are both taken to a hospital and Sofia is left by herself with others in quarantine unable to talk to anyone because she didn't know English. Finally, an interpreter talked to her and told he she would need to stay in quarantine until her sisters were released. Elin had typhoid fever and Kristen was weak and possibly facing deportation back to Sweden. A German man becomes friends with Sofia. They didn't speak the same language but he found verses in the Bible that they could look at in their own Bibles and communicate a little. When Elin and Kristin were released, they were able to take the train to Chicago.

Sofia's friend ends up sending his violin and Bible with Sofia hoping he would be able to see her again. Their uncle and aunt were not what they expected and didn't want them to stay long with them. They found a job as servants hired to clean a mansion. Though it was hard work they did the best job they could and eventually the woman they were working for began to care deeply for them. Through the grace of God, they all

eventually found the homes they were dreaming of.

While We're Far Apart: by Lynn Austin, a story that shows how everyone suffers during WWII. Jews that are American citizens worry about the family they have left in Europe and wonder if they will ever see them again. Families of servicemen worry constantly about their loved ones and pray they will never get the dreaded telegram. HAPPY READING!!
